The jewel in the crown of New South Wales tourism, Lord Howe Island is a tiny treasure rising out of crystal clear blue waters. Truly one of the world's last unspoiled island destinations, and yet so close to home, travel arrangements are a 'snap' to organise.

Coveted by many who have visited this natural wonderland as 'the most beautiful island on the planet', Lord Howe is best described as a serene state of perpetual calm.

Small in size (11kms long and 2kms wide) yet offering world class accommodation, the island is a lover's paradise waiting to be experienced and explored.

Laze on the warm sand of a perfect, tranquil, safe beach. Try your hand at fishing, scuba diving, dolphin watching, whale spotting, swimming in the strikingly clear blue waters, walking, hiking, or a host of available organised activities.

Walk along unspoilt beaches, see the crystal lagoon bordered by the world's most Southern Coral Reef, or take an aerial visit to Ball's Pyramid - the single highest rock in the world. Gaze through the glass bottomed boat, go mountain climbing, play tennis or a round of golf on the lush greens, cruise on the bay - the choice is yours.

You can be as energetic or as relaxed on Lord Howe as you want.

At the **Pinetrees Resort** you'll find the lagoon beach just across the road for your early morning swim (if you have nothing interesting to do in bed!). You can enjoy dinners prepared by professional chefs with superb produce...fresh fruit, homemade breads, fish caught the same day, locally grown vegetables, and tempting desserts. In the dining room you'll be served a romantic candlelit meal whilst looking out over the flood lit Kentia Palms where the wood hens often scratch around and show off their chicks.

The accommodation at Pine Trees ranges from comfortable motel style units with verandahs to world class 60sq cottages with a 16m² private outdoor terrace to revel in the balmy night breezes. Each cottage is beautifully furnished and set amongst fully landscaped gardens that blend with surrounding palms, pine trees, tropical frangipanis, and hibiscus.

Arajilla is a retreat in the true sense of the word. A tranquil haven, nestled between lush mountain pastures and the crystal blue waters of Old Settlement Beach, you'll find Arajilla at the sheltered northern end of the island.

Arajilla's luxury suites and superb dining provide the perfect base from which to enjoy everything Lord Howe has to offer. Set in a forest of Banyan Trees & Kentia Palms are twelve exclusive units. Each unit has its own private deck, separate living area, kitchenette and private facilities. Pathways meander through the resort connecting the suites and family apartments to the barbecue areas, lagoon and world class restaurant.

Born from a volcanic eruption some seven million years ago, Lord Howe Island is one of just four island groups to be awarded a World Heritage Listing. No matter where you look on Lord Howe breathtaking scenery and tropical treats abound. Lush green fields and tracts of bushland rise at the southern tip of the island to two towering mountains - their peaks often shrouded in mystical

cloud.

Only 280 lucky people live on the island, and visitors are restricted by law to 400 at any one time. Secluded, intimate and a whole world away from 'real life', Lord Howe Island is the perfect way to forget everything but one another.
